



Cuphea *hyssopifolia* 'Lavender' Plant Culture Information



Common Name:	Cuphea <i>hyssopifolia</i> 'Lavender'		
Description:	A variety with green foliage and petite, lavender flowers that can be grown in areas with a restricted water regime.		
Features:	A lovely lavender Cuphea variety that is extremely versatile and can be used for small or large containers, combinations, hanging baskets or in the landscape. Blooms nearly year-round (from February to November) and is perfect for attracting butterflies and hummingbirds.		
Uses:	Small pots, gallon containers and hanging baskets.		
pH:	6.0 - 6.5	EC 0.6 - 0.9	
Temperature:	65 - 75° F day and night (but not below 60°F)		
Light:	Full sun		
Irrigation:	Moderate, well-drained soils. Drought tolerant.		
Planting:	4" Pot	1 cutting	5 to 7 weeks
	Gallon	3 cuttings	7 to 9 weeks
Fertilization:	Feed with 20-10-20 at 150- 200 ppm		
Regulators:	Not needed		
Diseases/Pest Control:	Letting the plants wilt will cause leaf burn and/or leaf drop. Oedema will occur if plants are kept too wet or grown under low light.
